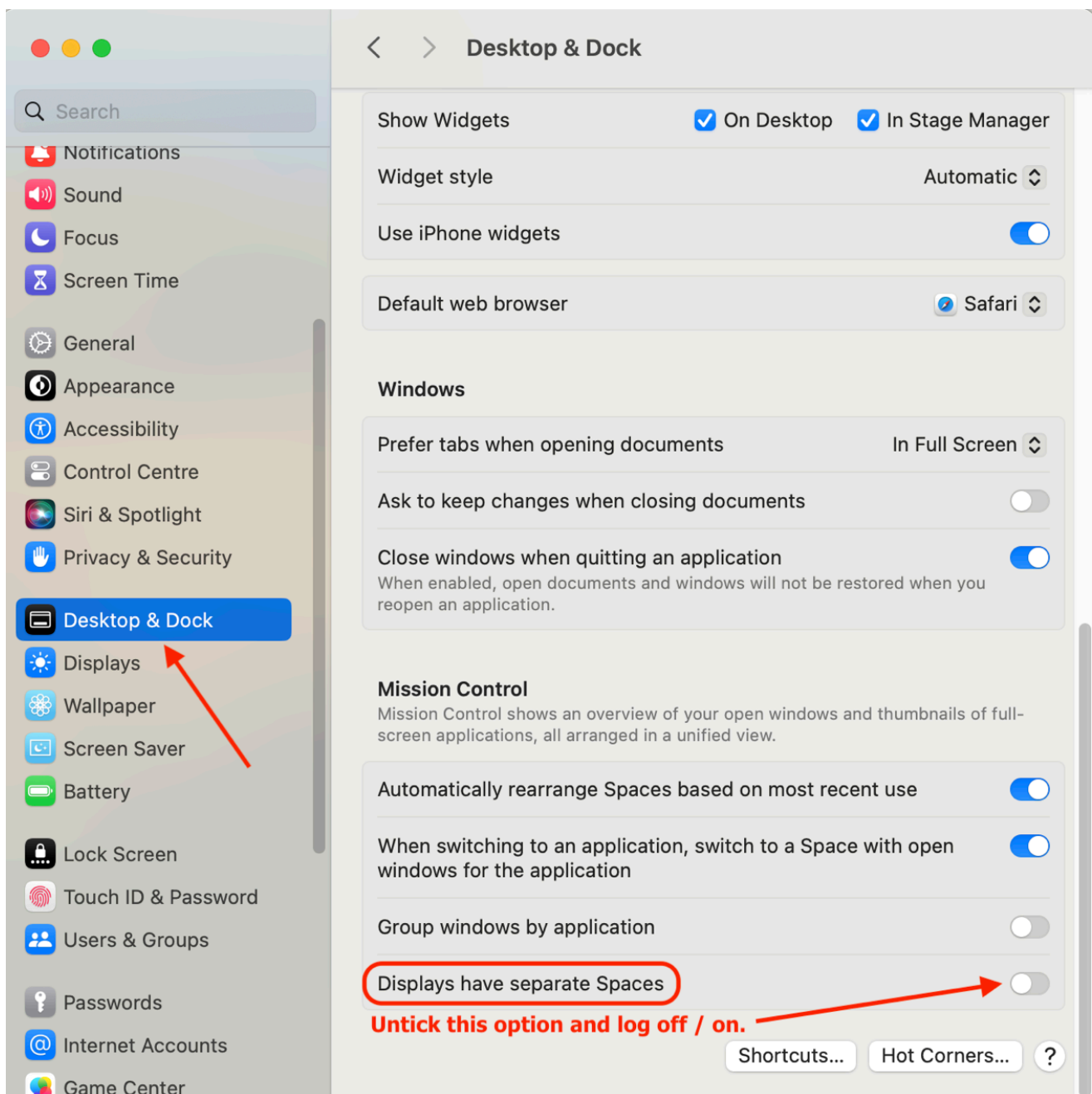


Hide menu bar on external display

Newer macOS operating systems


To hide menu bar on external display go to System Settings > Desktop & Dock, scroll down to Mission Control and untick Displays have separate Spaces option. Then log off and back on.



Older macOS operating systems

To hide menu bar on external display go to System Preferences > Mission Control and untick Displays have separate Spaces option. Then log off and back on.



 Mission Control gives you an overview of all your open windows, thumbnails of your full-screen applications, and Dashboard, all arranged in a unified view.

- Automatically rearrange Spaces based on most recent use
- When switching to an application, switch to a Space with open windows for the application
- Group windows by application

Displays have separate Spaces Requires log out

Dashboard:

Untick this option and log off / on.

Keyboard and Mouse Shortcuts

With a single keystroke, view all open windows, windows of the current application, or hide windows to locate an item on the desktop that might be covered up.
